

May God grant us the wisdom, courage, and strength to fulfill our sacred duty with courage and love, knowing that He walks alongside us every step of the way.





Aside from Mental Health Week, here are a few other things we are and have been working on:

- Choices Event: The Grade 9 classes from all schools in St Paul, Ashmont, Mallaig, Elk Point, and Heinsburg will be participating in the Choices event on May 2nd, including a mock collision and several speakers. Our keynote is Kevin Brooks.
- 2. Parent Presentation: Also on May 2nd, our Division is hosting Ariel Haubrich again. She will be speaking at Regional High School from 6:30-8:30 pm. Admission is free. See details on poster.

Student Success at Racette Junior High School

One of our main priorities at Racette School is to ensure student success. Individual teachers are the main facilitators for students in their learning, however, sometimes additional support may be required. Every day there is a 25-minute period just before lunch. It is referred to as SST (Student Support Team). During this scheduled period, students will be able to do AR reading, get caught up on missing assignments, study, or re-do assessments.
