
Student Absences


/ Students work on many tasks using Google apps.

Here is what you need to know for logging in.



- 1. Open a Google Chrome internet browser.
- 2. In the top right hand corner of the screen, there is a sign in button. Click on it.
- 3. Type in the student SPERD email account information. For example, if my name is Carly Smith, I would type smitcarl@students.sperd.ca
- 4. Now type in the student password. Students have been using this regularly and should know it.
- 5. You are now signed in to Google and can easily access the different platforms. These are most easily accessed by clicking on the 'waffle' in the top right hand corner of the screen.
- 6. Once the 'waffle' is clicked, the icons for Google Drive, Google Classroom, Google Meet, and Gmail will be available for you to click.


"Testify! Share the Reason for your Hope!"


Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Among the many beautiful gifts flowing to us from the font of God's providential love is that of our Catholic schools. At their centre stands the person of Jesus Christ, who seeks a personal and life-transforming encounter with each of the students. From our knowledge and love of Christ arises an unshakeable hope that fills us with peace and joy.

In his first letter, Saint Peter teaches us always to be ready to share with others the reason for our hope (cf. *1Peter* 3:15). The urgency of this call is underscored in our day by the widespread anxiety and, at times, despair seizing the hearts of many people, including some of our students and their families. For this reason, the Catholic educational community of Alberta, the Northwest Territories, and the Yukon has chosen as the theme of Catholic Education Week: "Testify! Share the Reason for your Hope". Let us all be ready and eager to give an account of the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

There are many opportunities to share this hope. We learn how to do so in the home, first of all. How beautiful it is when parents share with their children the story of their relationship with Jesus and the hope they have drawn from his love! Our participation in the life of the parish is another privileged venue where we become ever more deeply grounded in the love of our Lord and the hope he alone can give. In Catholic Education Week, we give particular attention to our schools as places where hope in Christ is not only fostered but also shared. In these Catholic institutions, students and staff alike are called to have a clear understanding of our faith and articulate it before others. So, let us ask: How might we share with one another the hope that springs from our relationship with Jesus Christ and fidelity to his Gospel? What opportunities can we create for these discussions – in the classroom, the staff room, the administration offices, or the trustee boardroom?





Of course, our readiness to explain our faith is about not only intellectual knowledge but also living it out authentically. When our words and actions align with Christ's teachings of love, compassion, and grace, the credibility of our testimony is strengthened. How can we help one another grow as authentic witnesses to the Lord?

With this letter, we, the Bishops of Alberta, the Northwest Territories, and the Yukon, wish to thank everyone involved in the ministry and mission of Catholic Education: our students, teachers, support staff, administrators, trustees, parents, and parish priests. We are grateful for the many ways you accept the call to lead our students to Jesus and help them embrace the hope he alone can give.

Together, let us joyfully share with others, in both word and deed, the joy we have found in Jesus Christ, who is the all-sufficient reason for the hope that animates our lives.

A Note From Mrs. Belland

I am the Mental Health Capacity Building (MHCB) staff for Racette School. Historically, our program has been funded through AHS, but due to the restructuring, we are now funded through Recovery Alberta, under the Ministry of Mental Health. We continue to be operated through St Paul Education. I am looking forward to another amazing year at Racette!

- 1.Introductions: Ms. Mahe and I have gone to each of the classes to introduce ourselves and explain our role in the school. Ms. Mahe sees students one-on-one for any issues they may have, big or small. I usually talk to full classes about mental health-related information.
- 2. **Words Stick:** This year in SST, my focus will be on a program called "Words Stick". Students will be given the opportunity to see the positive and negative outcomes of the things they say to others, and then will be given the opportunity to give, and receive, positive comments to each of their classmates. I have begun this process with the 7-1's and 7-2's and will gradually make my way to each class as the year goes on.
- 3. **Feeding Your Brain:** I have visited the 7-3's and 7-1's to talk about the effects that nutrition has on our brain and mental health.
- 4. Heartmath: In October the Grade 9's will be learning about the Heartmath program in SST. This program teaches about regulating our emotions. We will talk about the different domains of health, how emotions can renew or drain our energy, and a few techniques to shift into a calmer more regulated state.
- 5. Noon Games: On days when I am at Racette, I also run a Noon Game as a fun opportunity for kids to socialize with others at lunch. Generally, we do a Minute to Win It game on Mondays, "icebreaker" style games on Tuesdays, Word Games on Wednesdays, Improv Games on Thursdays, and Traditional Board/Card games on Fridays.



September Board Highlights

Student Success at Racette Junior High School

One of our main priorities at Racette School is to ensure student success. Individual teachers are the main facilitators for students in their learning, however, sometimes additional support may be required. Every day there is a 23-minute period just before lunch. It is referred to as SST (Student Support Team). During this scheduled period, students will be able to do AR reading, get caught up on missing assignments, study, or re-do assessments.
