



One major achievement this season was our second place finishing at the Ecole du Sommet tournament.


Despite the wins and losses, the team grew not only in confidence as players, but in collaboration and

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A Note From Mrs. Belland

Merry Christmas! We are looking forward to a wonderful break, but in the meantime, here are some things I have been working on and talking about:

- 1. Words Stick: I am continuing to facilitate this program during SST in December with the 8-1's and 8-2's. I continue to hope that through a demonstration of the power of negative comments, practice writing positive comments, and receiving positive comments, students will begin to say and post more positive things to each other.
- 2. Heartmath: In November the Grade 9's have been learning about the Heartmath program in SST. This program teaches how to regulate emotions. We have talked about the different domains of health and how emotions can renew or drain our energy, and have learned a couple techniques that can help students to self-regulate and access their inner sense of ease.
- **3. Friendship:** Throughout the year I will be talking about conflict resolution skills with each grade. In November I am planning to talk to the **Grade 6's** in SST about how to cope with Changes in Friendship.
- 4. **SMART Goals:** I have visited the **6-1 and 6-2 health classes** to help them learn about SMART Goals. By learning to make their goals Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, and Timed, we hope they will be able to take steps towards their academic and wellness pursuits.


