

Six teams competed in the mixed category, representing Two Hills, École du Sommet, Racette (two teams), and Mallaig (two teams). Racette emerged victorious, defeating Mallaig in the final to win the SPAA banner.

The event was well-attended, with a rink full of spectators. All teams demonstrated excellent sportsmanship throughout the tournament.











A Note From Mrs. Belland

Welcome to February, a month full of love and kindness! Here are some things I have been working on and talking about:

- 1. Words Stick: I am just finishing up with the 7-3's and 8-3's with this program and will be starting with the 9-1's and 9-2's soon. This is a program that I am using for all students at Racette this year. Students are learning about the power of negative comments, practicing writing positive comments, and receiving positive comments. I am hopeful this will help students to think carefully about what they say online and offline.
- 2. **Alcohol and Addiction:** As part of the health curriculum, I have visited the **8-1's** and all of the **grade 9 health classes** to discuss the physical and mental health concerns around substance use and addictions.
- 3. **Noon Games:** On days when I am at Racette, I continue to facilitate a noon game. Typically we do movement games on Mondays, "icebreaker" style games on Tuesdays, word games on Wednesdays, improv games on Thursdays, and traditional board/card games on Fridays.
- 4. **Pink Shirt Day:** This is a time when we focus on kindness to prevent bullying. Our Words Stick program is working on this throughout the school year, but I also have a small project planned specific to Pink Shirt Day. There will be more details soon!
